



Minutes of the Cheriton Bishop Parish Council meeting held at 7.50 pm on Monday, 11th May, 2026 at The Spalding Hall, Cheriton Bishop.

Present: Chair Peter O'Neil, Vice Chair Cllr R. Marshall and Cllr A. Fry and Cllr C. Royle. Mid Devon District Council (MDDC) Cllr M. Binks and four members of the public present.

- 1. To receive Declarations of Interest** None
- 2. Public Discussion:** A member of the public asked to be introduced to the new councillors.
- 3. To receive and accept apologies.** MDDC Cllr Cairney
- 4. To approve the co-option of a new councillor.** Nicole Savage was co-opted onto the parish council. Nicole Savage introduced her self to the parish council. She has lived in the village for a year and in Devon since 1989. She is keen to help with fund raising and can draw upon her experience as an events organiser and hopes this background will be useful and looks forward to working with the council and residents. The co-option of Nicole Savage was proposed by Cllr Marshall and seconded by Cllr O'Neill and the vote was unanimous by a show of hands.

- 10. To review, approve and sign the Accounting Statements 2025-2026.** The council approved the Accounting Statement 2025-2026 unanimously by a show of hands.
- 11. To approve the dates for the Exercise of Public Rights as Wednesday, 1st July 2026 – Tuesday, 4th August, 2026.** The council approved the period for the Exercise of Public Rights as proposed unanimously by a show of hands.

Note, April meeting cancelled. The council approved the March minutes unanimously by a show of hands.
- 13. To receive reports from MDDC Councillors - for information only.** Cllr Binks reported there is new leader of the MDDC as existing leader resigned for personal reasons. The new leader is Cllr David Wulf. (Lib Dem), and Cllr Binks said the new leader is a hard-working, effective and dynamic councillor. Local Government Reorganisation continues but the conclusions are yet to be made public. It is hoped there will be more information available in September.
- 14. To receive a report from Devon County Council (DCC) - for information only.** None
- 15. To confirm arrangement for an open event for community members to discuss issues and suggestions with councillors.** The Chair said he had sympathy for the point made during the Annual Assembly about visibility of parish councillors and the parish council's work. Following a discussion, it was agreed to hold an informal open event when residents can talk with councillors about any issue and give their ideas for the uses of the money that will be forthcoming from the levy available to Cheriton Bishop Parish Council as a consequence of a new housing in the parish. It is to be an informal and friendly event, such as a coffee morning. MDDC Cllr Binks advised that through previous experience of similar events, he recommended that it is helpful to link it to another public event, such as a village show. It was agreed to approach the village show committee with regard to this option. **CHAIR TO ACTION**
 1. Following a discussion, the date for the coffee morning is 6th June. The Chair to enquire if the village hall is available. A working group was set up comprising Cllr Royle and Cllr Savage to organise and publicise the event. **CLLRS ROYLE AND SAVAGE TO ACTION**
- 16. To confirm plans for the Village Party.** As approved previously, the date for the village party is now confirmed as Sunday, 5th July, 2026. The volunteer team are happy to do the same work they carried out last year. Steve Coldridge is organising the music. Arrangements were approved by the council unanimously by a show of hands. The event will run from 2-6 pm. There are facilities inside the Rural Hub should the weather turn cold/wet.



17. Consider submitting an expression of interest for transfer of ownership of Glebelands Play Area to the Parish Council. The Chair proposed that the parish council express an interest to own the Glebelands Play Area and the council agreed unanimously by a show of hands. Chair to write to MDDC . **CHAIR TO ACTION**

18. Repairs & Maintenance – to consider any repairs and maintenance needed for PC assets. As raised in the Assembly, the gate to the Glebelands Play Area needs attention.
